STAFF SPOTLIGHT

The **Town Administrator**, Leighanna Worley, is the chief administrator of the Town and is appointed by the Town Council. The administrator is responsible for ensuring that all local, state, and federal laws and regulations are met; that all operations and projects are functional, efficient, and sustainable; implementing philosophies and policy decisions of the council; managing the performance of all Town departments; providing for economic and downtown development; and responding to citizen requests and concerns.

The **Town Clerk**, Emily Matthews, serves as a direct link between citizens of the community and their government. The Town Clerk serves as custodian of official public records; communicator of public policy; organizer of public business; recorder of the community's history; performer of many varied tasks that assist in the smooth operation of local governance.

The **Finance Officer**, Sherry Hudson, is responsible for maintaining a governmental accounting system that presents accurately, with full disclosure, the financial operations of the Town of Wilson's Mills.

The **Administrative Assistant**, Starr Crocker, serves as the "face" of Wilson's Mills Town Hall. She is the first person who greets you upon arrival to Town Hall and the first to answer and assist incoming calls. She performs a variety of administrative and technical work and is responsible for several administrative tasks related to administration, finance, human resources, grant administration and other related duties as assigned.

TIRED OF THESE? WE ARE TOO, BUT THERE'S GOOD NEWS

We've all seen them, the bright orange and white striped construction barrels that seem to be on almost every major roadway in Wilson's Mills. But within the coming year, you won't be seeing as many of them. NCDOT has released updates that affect the Wilson's Mills area and surrounding communities.

- 1 At the end of April, DOT will begin median construction, switching traffic to the outside lane, East of Wilson's Mills Road to Turnage Road.
- 2 Access to Uzzle Industrial Drive via US 70 Hwy will be closed March 25, 2024. A new service road from Sadisco Road to Strickland Road will open to access this area.
- 3 The on ramp from Swift Creek Road to US 70 East will open towards the beginning of May 2024.
- 4 Completion of the interchange at Wilson's Mills Road and US Hwy 70 will be completed by September 2024. This includes shifting US Hwy 70 traffic onto the new bridges and removing traffic lights at the future on & off ramps onto Wilson's Mills Road.
- 5 Final Paving and Pavement Marking, completion by Spring 2025. Flatiron intends to begin final pavement & markings on all service roads within the next 2 months, then moving to sections of US Hwy 70 as they become ready.

Board of Adjustment is a board comprised of three citizens living within town limits and two citizens living within town extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ).

This board holds public hearings to make decisions on requests made by property owners for appeals, requests for variances, and to decide all matters under the Town's Unified Development Ordinance.

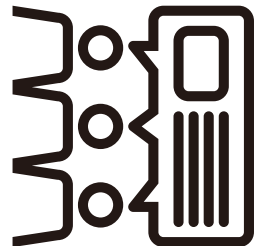
The Board of Adjustment meets on an "as-needed" basis. The Town is searching for two in-town alternates, and one ETJ alternate.
